WEEKLY WEATHER STATEMENT

18TH TO 24TH MARCH 2024

SUMMARY OF WEATHER AHEAD

During the period from Monday 18th to Sunday 24th March 2024 expect windy and partly cloudy to cloudy conditions with localized heavy thunderstorms and rain mainly over northern and some central areas while a gradual reduction in rainfall activities is expected over the south. This is due to the inflow of unstable easterly airmass which at times are expected to converge with south easterlies. Mwera winds are expected occasionally over our water bodies.

WEATHER DURING PAST WEEK

Scattered thunderstorms and rains were observed with localized heavy rains over the south and north. Khanda in Zomba reported the highest 24-hourly rainfall of **170.3mm** and Zalewa Agriculture reported **135.2mm** on 14th March 2024. It was very hot as the temperature anomalies throughout the country were in the range of **3** – **5.4°Celcius** and the highest temperature anomaly of **5.4°Celcius** was observed from Mimosa in Mulanje on 15th March, 2024.


