**04TH MAY TO 10TH MAY, 2026**

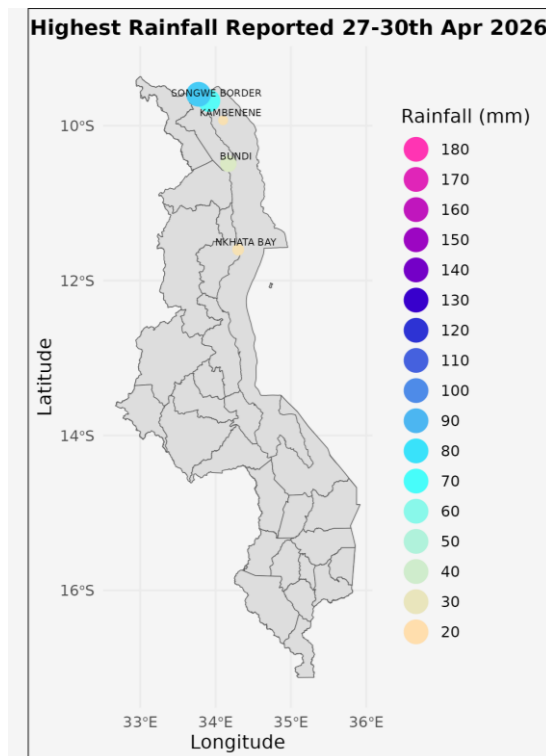
#### **SUMMARY OF WEATHER AHEAD**

Expect generally partly cloudy and warm to hot conditions with cool temperatures during nighttime and early in the morning from Tuesday 05<sup>th</sup> May to Sunday 10<sup>th</sup> May 2026 due to the influence of predominantly easterly air mass. Foggy conditions are anticipated in valleys, mainly during morning hours.

#### **WEATHER DURING PAST WEEK**

Most areas experienced partly cloudy and cool to hot conditions with isolated rain especially over northern lakeshore areas. Songwe Water Board station in Karonga reported the highest 24-hourly rainfall amount of about **85.2mm**.

The map below shows recorded rainfall above 20mm from 27<sup>th</sup> to 30<sup>th</sup> April 2026.
