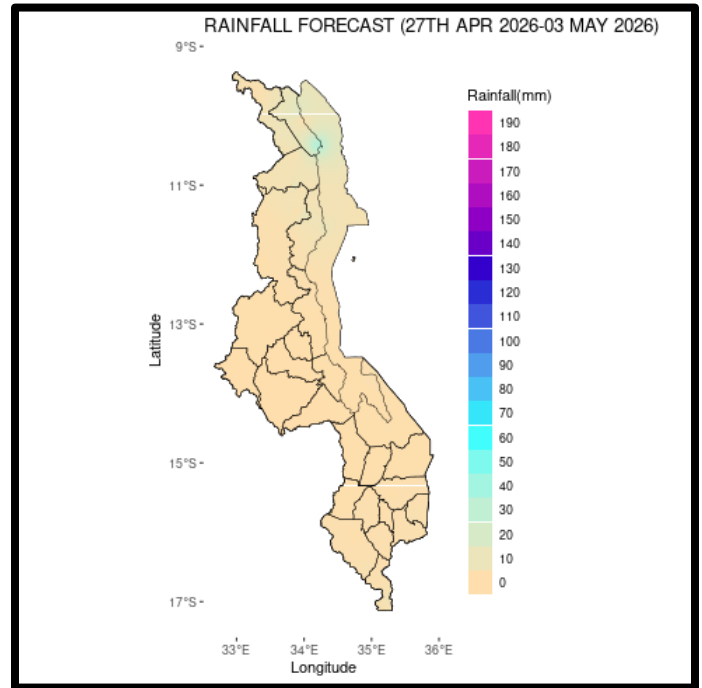
**SUMMARY OF WEATHER AHEAD**

Expect partly cloudy and foggy conditions with isolated thunderstorm and rain mainly over northern lakeshore areas tomorrow 27<sup>th</sup> and Tuesday 28<sup>th</sup> April 2026.

The isolated rains will extend to Central and Southern Region Districts from Wednesday 29<sup>th</sup> April to Thursday 30<sup>th</sup> April 2026. It will also be windy, cloudy and foggy. This is due to the influence of southeasterly airmass.

From Friday 1<sup>st</sup> May 2026 till the end of forecast period, anticipate partly cloudy conditions with rain especially over northern lakeshore areas due to the influence of easterly air mass.

**Moderate to strong Mwera winds are also expected over all water bodies.**

**WEATHER DURING PAST WEEK**

Generally, windy, partly cloudy to cloudy and warm to hot conditions with isolated rains mainly over northern lakeshore areas.

The highest reported 24-hourly rainfall amount was **31.1mm from Kambenene station in Karonga on 22<sup>nd</sup> April, 2026.**
