02ND MARCH TO 08TH MARCH, 2026

SUMMARY OF WEATHER AHEAD

Mostly cloudy conditions with light to moderate **thunderstorms and rain from Monday 02nd March 2026 to Thursday 05th March 2026**, increasing in amounts thereafter, over most parts of the country. This is due to the influence of an unstable easterly airmass.

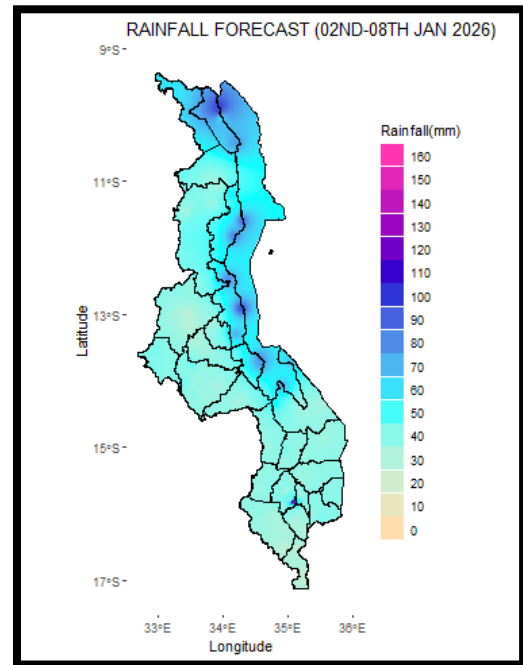


Figure 1: Cumulative rainfall forecast from 02nd to 08th March 2026

WEATHER DURING PAST WEEK

The northern part of the country experienced scattered thunderstorms with heavy rainfall in some areas, while the southern region recorded isolated rainfall. **The highest 24-hour rainfall amount, 124.4 mm, was recorded at Mlare in Karonga District on 01st March 2026.**

Thunderstorms: As thunderstorms are expected, the public is advised to **stay indoors where possible and avoid taking shelter under trees during thunderstorms.**

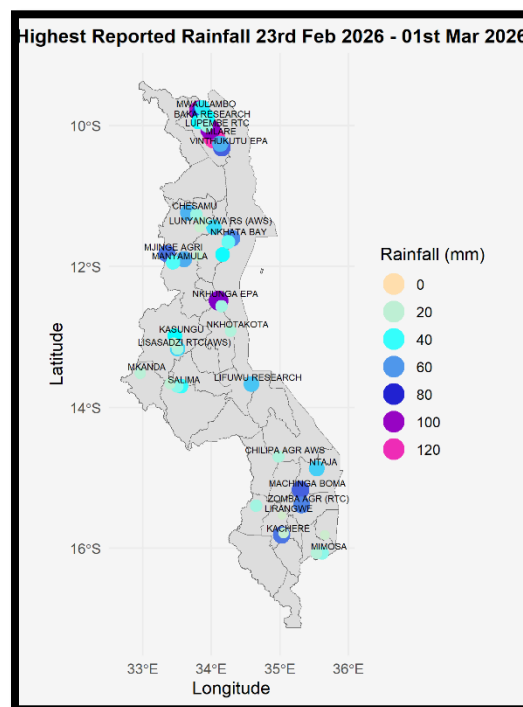


Figure 2: Highest rainfall reported between 23rd February and 01st March 2026
