

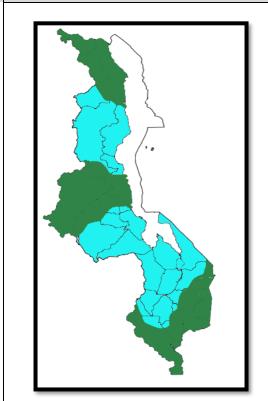

Air Quality Forecast Bulletin

Date of Issue: 16th September 2025

2. Forecast Summary

From 17th to 18th September 2025, air quality across most areas is expected to be moderate but from 19th September till the end of forecast period the situation is expected to improve significantly across the country. This means that generally the air quality is expected to be in the GOOD category. The MODERATE levels are due to increased vehicular emissions, dusty conditions, and open burning. Occasionally windy, and dry weather ahead may contribute to pollution accumulation, especially in Lilongwe, Blantyre, Zomba, Mzuzu, and Mzimba.

The observed highest peak of air quality value of index during the past week were as follows; Luwinga (Mzuzu)- 168, Chirunga (Zomba)- 208.5, Mubas (Blantyre)- 212.3, Chichiri (Blantyre)- 252.8, Mchesi (Lilongwe)- 444.8 and Namiwawa (Blantyre)- 500.

3. Expected Sources of Pollution

- Open burning of waste.
- Vehicle emissions.
- Dust from bare ground and construction.

4. Air Quality Index (AQI) Levels Explained

AQI Colour	Level of Concern	Value of Index	Description of Air Quality
Green	GOOD	0 to 50	Air quality is satisfactory, and air pollution poses little or
			no risk.
Aqua Blue	MODERATE	51 to 100	Air quality is acceptable. However, there may be a risk for
			some people, particularly those sensitive to pollution.
Yellow	UNHEALTHY FOR	101 to 150	Members of sensitive groups may experience health effects.
	SENSITIVE GROUPS		The general public is less likely to be affected.
Orange	UNHEALTHY	151 to 200	Some of the general public may experience health effects;
			sensitive groups may experience more serious effects.
Red	DANGEROUS	At least 201	Health Alert: The risk of health effects is increased for
			everyone.
