WEEKLY WEATHER STATEMENT 06TH TO 12TH OCTOBER, 2025

SUMMARY OF WEATHER AHEAD


An increase in day time temperature is expected across Malawi, during this week, **6th to 12th October 2025**. The skies will be partly cloudy and hazy as warm easterly air mass dominates.

Although the week will be marked by dry heat, localized convergence may generate brief, isolated light rains in some few areas. Meanwhile, **moderate Mvuma winds** are expected occasionally over Lake Malawi and other water bodies throughout the week.

WEATHER DURING PAST WEEK

Most areas experienced cool, windy and cloudy conditions with localized thunderstorms and rain. The highest maximum temperature anomaly was recorded from Chitedze Research station in Lilongwe at 2.8°C on 01st October 2025. Otherwise, it was cooler than normal over the southern districts of the country, where Mulanje and Thyolo registered negative anomaly of -4°C.

The maps on the right show the highest maximum temperature anomalies for the past week by comparing with October historical temperatures.

Safety advisories:

- **Hot weather:** Remember to drink water frequently even when you don't feel thirsty to stay cool and hydrated.
- Thunderstorms: Seek shelter in safer places.
- Lake conditions: Avoid fishing, swimming or using small boats and canoes during rough conditions.
- **Air quality:** Due to occasional windy conditions, it will be dusty, which may reduce air quality. Remember to wear a mask when it is dusty.
