1ST – 7TH SEPTEMBER 2025

SUMMARY OF WEATHER AHEAD

Expect sunny, dusty, hazy, and hot weather during this week. Occasional outbreaks of Mwera winds are likely on Lake Malawi mainly on Tuesday, Wednesday, and over the weekend, due to the influence of a dry air mass from the Indian Ocean. While mvuma winds will be dominant the rest of days which may occasionally be strong.

WEATHER DURING PAST WEEK

Most parts of the South and Centre recorded warmer than average minimum temperatures in August, while in the North most areas were cooler than normal. Mzuzu reported the lowest minimum temperature of **7.8°C** on 30TH August, with an anomaly of **-1.9°C**. However, during daytime, many areas, experienced hot weather, with Ngabu in Chikwawa recording the highest temperature of **35.9 °C** on 27TH August.




Fig: Shows minimum temperature anomaly for the past week.

Safety advisories:

- **Hot weather:** Remember to drink water frequently to remain cool and hydrated.
- **Lake conditions:** Avoid fishing, swimming or using small boats and canoes during rough conditions.
- **Air quality:** Due to occasional windy conditions, sometimes it will be dusty, which may reduce air quality. Remember to wear a mask when it is dusty.
