WEEKLY WEATHER STATEMENT 15TH - 21ST SEPTEMBER 2025

SUMMARY OF WEATHER AHEAD

The week is likely to be dominated by sunny, occasionally dusty, hazy, and hot weather over most areas, due to the influence of a warm and dry air mass from the Indian Ocean.

WEATHER DURING PAST WEEK

Most parts of the country experienced sunny, hazy, and hot weather. However, on Tuesday, some southern areas, including parts of Zomba and Nsanje, experienced some isolated rain. Generally, the country recorded warmer than average minimum temperatures in September. Mzuzu reported the lowest minimum temperature of 9.5°C on 8th September, with an anomaly of

-1.1°C, which was also the lowest anomaly. Meanwhile, Ngabu in Chikwawa recorded the highest maximum temperature of 36.4°C on 13th September 2025.




Fig: Minimum temperature anomaly for the past week.
