WEEKLY WEATHER STATEMENT
22ND TO 28TH DECEMBER, 2025

SUMMARY OF WEATHER AHEAD

From tomorrow 22nd December 2025 to Thursday, 25th December 2025, expect cloudy conditions with scattered thunderstorms and rain showers coupled with localized heavy rains mainly over southern areas and parts of central areas. Isolated thunderstorms and reduced rainfall amounts are expected from Friday, 26 December 2025, due to the presence of a weak low-pressure system in the Mozambique Channel.

Figure 1 (right) shows the cumulative rainfall forecast across Malawi, highlighting areas with localized heavy rainfall.




Figure 1 Cumulative rainfall forecast for 22nd to 28th December 2025

WEATHER DURING PAST WEEK

The country experienced scattered thunderstorms and rainfall, which were locally heavy in some areas. The highest reported rainfall amount was 105.5 mm, recorded on 20th December 2025 at Mwaulambo in Karonga District.

Figure 2 (right) illustrates the highest rainfall amounts reported during the past week.




Figure 2: Highest rainfall reported during last week.
