WEEKLY WEATHER STATEMENT 17TH TO 23RD JUNE, 2024

SUMMARY OF WEATHER AHEAD

From June 17th to 23rd, 2024, temperatures will be chilly at night and early mornings, with patches of fog. During the day, sunny and warm weather is expected due to less humid air from the Indian Ocean. Isolated light rains are possible on June 17th and 21st. Additionally, strong Mwera winds over Lake Malawi and other water bodies will reduce by June 18th.

WEATHER DURING PAST WEEK

Most areas experienced cold temperatures especially during nighttime and early morning hours.

- 1. Northern areas, Mzuzu and Mzimba in northern areas experienced the coldest temperatures, reaching a low of 6°C. This was 3 degrees Celsius below the average minimum temperature for the region.
- 2. Central areas, Kamuzu International Airport in Lilongwe, recorded a temperature of 6°C. Notably, this temperature was significantly lower than the average temperature for the area, which is typically 9.2°C, representing a 3°C departure from the norm.
- 3. Southern highlands, Dedza recorded low minimum temperature of 6°C on June 14, 2024, a significant 4 degrees Celsius below the average minimum temperature for June.
- 4. In Shire valley, Ngabu in Chikwawa reported 14°C on 13TH June 2024, which is 2 degrees Celsius below the average minimum temperature in the area.
- 5. Lakeshore areas, Nkhatabay recorded the lowest minimum temperature of 12°C on 14TH June 2024. This reading was 2 degrees Celsius below the average minimum temperature for the area.
- 6. Patches of fog and isolated rain drizzle were also reported.

SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

Lake Activities: Avoid fishing, swimming, or using small boats and canoes during Mwera winds.

Dress Warmly: Wear warm clothing, especially for the elderly and children, to protect themselves against the cold associated with chilly weather.

Ventilation: Avoid charcoal burners in poorly ventilated rooms to prevent potential carbon monoxide poisoning.

Asthma Precautions: Individuals with asthma (mphumu) should exercise extra caution during chilly weather, as the cold air can trigger respiratory issues.

Foggy Driving: Drivers should proceed with extreme caution during foggy conditions due to significantly reduced visibility.
